262 million children around the world do not have access to education

School in a Bag is an initiative that delivers attractive bright red rucksacks full of stationery resources to poor orphan, vulnerable and disaster-affected children globally.

Luke Simon founded the Charity as the Piers Simon Appeal (PSA) in 2005 shortly after his brother Piers lost his life in the 2004 Boxing Day tsunami.

In 2008 the PSA were invited to join the disaster relief charity Shelter Box and they became part of a joint project to send school equipment to Swaziland. In 2011 PSA decided to take on its own identity and create **School in a Bag** and from then on it has gone from strength to strength. Since its inauguration 140,000 bags have been delivered to 52 countries.

All money has been raised from public donations.

School in a Bag is run by a 4-person team operating from an old converted barn in Chilthorne Domer near Yeovil, Somerset. Diverse groups of volunteers, supporters, partners and donors are giving unstinted time, expertise, enthusiasm, reassurance and faith every step of the way.

School in Bag was born out of disaster (albeit a natural one) so it is not surprising it has set up an Appeal specifically to help Ukrainian Refugees. It works with two existing charities, the Chernobyl Life Line Charity and Te Aud Romania. Both can help to get School Bags to families who have fled Ukraine seeking refuge in neighbouring countries. Both are right at the forefront of the Ukrainian Crisis and good communication ensures the bags can be delivered efficiently.
