As I write the sun shines yet again, and this spell of recent good weather has been enjoyed by many people being able to meet up with friends outside. It has also made the exit from our church services less harsh as we have at least been able to catch up, albeit briefly, outside the church building. For those who run hospitality businesses the weather has indeed been kind thus far. When I visited Altrincham shopping centre recently the high street was busy, and I sensed a careful confidence in people as everyone went about their business or enjoyed a coffee outside.

I have also had a pleasant walk this week at the RSPB reserve at Burton Mere Wetlands at Neston near Chester. The place was very peaceful with the birdsong the dominant sound, and the highlight for me was to see the avocets using their long upcurved beaks to unearth crustaceans and worms from the mud below. Avocets, though still a protected species, have made a comeback into our country since their elimination from our shores in the earlier part of the 20th century. They are a conservation success which is why they are on the RSPB logo.

Whether it is the hustle and bustle of the high street, or the quietness of a nature reserve, a coffee with friends or even attending church services; all these things have become possible again through the efforts of all of us to play our part in following guidance and receiving vaccinations.
